


# Discovery Service User Manual

## 1. Search Screen (Basic Search/Advanced Search)

### 【Basic Search Screen】

Displays links to New searches and publications (electronic journal and e-books subscribed to by the library)


**3 Links**  
Displays links to the university homepage and the library homepage.

**4 Search Box**  
Please enter a search term.

You can quickly narrow your search using frequently used filters.

**6 Advanced Search**  
Switch to advanced search screen

**7 Search Box**  
Enter your search term.

**8 Field Selection**  
Select the field you want to search

**9 Add Search Terms**  
Add search terms using operators such as "AND/OR/NOT"

**10 Add Search Criteria**


- Filters : Add filters

### ※How to change display language

The interface display language can be switched to a total of 33 languages, including Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, German, Spanish, and Italian.  
To change the language, go to the top right of the screen: **MyEBSCO** → **User Settings** → **Language Selection**, choose your preferred language, and then click **Save**




Displays definition of terms, research method, recommended reading, and other information for over 50,000 academic topics.

**Description**  
The following article describes a study developed in the course of Theory and Practice of Design, School of Applied Arts, Polytechnic Institute of Castelo Branco, Portugal, in the academic year 2020/21. The study follows the methodologies of descriptive case study and thematic analysis. Taking as its starting point the problem of environmental protection and taking as premises that the cultural environment shapes the concept of Nature and that early childhood experiences have the potential to validate a code associated with Nature. The study aimed to study and identify codes referring to the concept of Nature in a target audience between 18 and 22 years old. The thematic analysis developed in the gathered textual descriptions, through the discovered patterns, points out that the first interaction experiences with Nature had older family members as facilitators, and the interactions took place in small cultivated areas. These results provide valuable clues on the complexity of visual communication, challenging the effectiveness of communication codes not adapted to local contexts.



# 4. Saving information

You can save information from the search result screen and detailed information screen.



### 1 Save icon

When you click the icon, it will change color, indicating your material has been saved. If you click it again, it will remove the saved item.

### 2 Tools icon


To save under a specific name, select " + Id to project" within the tools selection.

You can also use the following tools:

- Cite: Create and copy citation information
- Share: Share via link, email, etc.
- Download

To set up alerts from the search result screen:  
From the **A:Tools** icon, select **B:Create alert**, and enter the necessary information.

- Alert name
- Description
- Frequency (Daily, Weekly, Monthly)

When creating an alert for the first time, be sure to enter your **C: Email address** to send the notification to. After that click on **D: Create alert**.

The next time you create another alert, entering the email address is not necessary.


